UTHUKELA LAUNCHES OPERATION VALA VULA

he UThukela District Municipality, under the tutelage of Municipal Manager, Mr LS Jili, has taken a decisive action by cutting off water supply connections to large users across the district. Collectively, these users owe over R84 million in municipal services. This campaign is part of UThukela District Municipality's proactive credit control

which was rolled out effectively on November 7.

With the municipality facing a mounting and unsustainable debt, the Operation Vala Vula (disconnect and reconnect) campaign aims to address the issue Through this exercise, the municipality is targeting major resi-

dential estates, investment firms, hospitals, car dealerships, schools and government departments among others, who contribute to the municipality's endless list of defaulters.

This exercise was conducted under the banner called Operation Vala Vula. The Municipal Manager Mr Jili emphasized that the municipality is acting tough against perpetual defaulters. He said these people are running away from their responsibility of paying what is due. He was, however, worried that some of the defaulters would not let them gain access to their property and warned against such practices.

"This exercise is part of our strategy to enhance our revenue collection in all areas including sector departments. We have started with those who owe us large amounts of money and we succeeded in doing disconnections".

"Although the teams encountered some problems in some areas where we were denied access to the property because we have our meters in those properties but we will resolve these issues", said Mr Jili

He went further to say that they were hoping that they will be able to collect what is due to the municipality. Various teams were deployed to Ladysmith, Estcourt, Winterton, Weenen and Bergville. The Municipal Manager appreciated the efforts and commitments of the teams working in different



UThukela warns the public to be vigilant of job scams



Two ladies came to UThukela District Offices at the Standard Bank building looking for "Mr Nhlapho" who allegedly scammed one lady. According to these ladies, they have seen the job advertisement on Facebook page in the Job Section with contact details. The scammer pretends to be an employee of the UThukela District Municipality employed in the HR department. The lady said she had applied for a Bookkeeper position that she saw, and sent her CV via WhatsApp as per the advertisement's instructions. She was informed that the position she applied for was a permanent post, and all she needed to do was to offer a "cold drink" (bribery).

The impersonator requested that an amount of R500 must be immediately sent via CashSend

to secure the position. This was because she was told there was going to be District Managers around, so it won't be easy to take the "cold drink", and she did exactly so. Thereafter, she was told to wait for him at UThukela District offices to be placed in her position. The ladies said they waited forever for the man to come until they saw the Municipal Manager Mr LS Jili coming in, thinking that he was the man they were waiting for.

According to the ladies, a TrueCaller reveals the real name of the user when they call. The MM has warned the public not to respond to any job advertisements they see without proper verification. "As the Uthukela District Municipality, we warn all potential job seekers to guard against such criminal activities, and remain vigilant at all material times", warns Mr Jili. Members of the public should know that this is a scam when:

-they see job advertisements on Facebook platforms without the logo and contact details of the municipality. The municipality does not advertise via Facebook. We advertise posts through conventional media platforms and our HR department follow all the recruitment processes;

-a potential victim is required to make payment fee in advance. The municipality does not request interview candidates or job seekers to pay any monies to any individual in any way whatsoever in exchange for job placement, and

-you are invited to come and collect the uniform without going through an interview process. There's no such thing, due processes are followed at all times.

We urge the public to be vigilant and not accept any job offer they did not apply for or never conducted any interview for.



Youth Office rolls out empowerment fund drive

he uThukela district Municipality's Youth Development Unit (YDU) has embarked on an intensive application drive for the KZN Youth Empowerment Fund administered by the Office m of the Premier. This comes after they open window for the applications to Youth owned businesses from 01 October to 01 November 2024 initially.

Some of the people who attended the event

However, this was extended to close on 29 November 2024. The programme was approved by the office of the Municipal Manager, Mr LS Jili, spanned over nine consecutive days, accommodating various sections of the district. It began at Inkosi Langalibalele, then proceeded to Okhahlamba and ended in Alfred Duma municipalities.

It is part of the YDU's culture to ensure that all locals benefit from the districts' programmes. The Youth Office expressed its of gratitude to the positive response they received from the Youth who were desperate to hear about the process of applying for the fund. The office was also pleased about the engagements they had with young people in different areas of the district.

The programme entailed providing Youth Fund Application forms, explaining how to fill the form, outlining the attachment documents to accompany the form, providing various advice on issues of compliance, responding to questions and developing list for those who require business management training. During this programme, the Unit made physical contacts with about 347 young people.

Part of the critical challenges unraveled during this process was that within our district, there is still a few number of businesses owned by the Youth. There's also a lack of knowledge on how to register a business. Some businesses do not know how to file for tax returns from CIPC which leads to business deregistration, non-compliance with SARS.

General lack of business management knowledge, basic training and the existing businesses do not have business plans inter-alia. Over and above, there are businesses who do comply with the necessary requirements hence they will submit their application. YDU is committed in assisting young people in the district in anyway possible.

In remedying part of the outcomes of the programme, the Unit will be approaching our various stakeholders who are competent in certain fields that are needed to service the youth. The National Youth Development Agency (NYDA) do assist in providing Business Management Training as well as Small Enterprise Development Agency (SEDA).

These government entities also help with business registration and development, drafting of business plans etc. The unit plans on holding business symposium around the district which will involved various stakeholders in order to help young people with business interests.

Mayor welcomes two new water tankers from CoGTA

n an effort to augment water supply in the UThukela District Municipality, His Worship the District Mayor Inkosi NB Shabalala welcomed two new water tankers from the MEC for Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs (CoGTA) the Honourable Rev. Thulasizwe Buthelezi. The handover event was held at the Alfred Duma Municipality Council Chambers.

In his opening remarks, Inkosi Shabalala welcomed with appreciation the intervention by the MEC COGTA highlighting the importance of water tankers to communities that do not have access to water infrastructure and during water outages.

"We have purchased 7 water tankers already as the municipality. Aging infrastructure is posing a challenge in water supply. There's a major water project that is currently taking place in Ekuvukeni. We hope that once it is finished, then there will be no need for water tankers for Ekuvukeni", said the Mayor.

He alluded to the fact that community protests have since decreased in the district. He also said the community of Weenen needs a honeysucker but due to financial constraints, UThukela District is unable to provide such service.

Taking to the podium, MEC Buthelezi said they were here to handover two water tankers to UThukela District, "Before the end of November, we will have a District Development Model session with the UThukela District, where we will monitor all water issues in the district. On the second day, we will monitor the water provision per ward and per voting district".

"We will also look at the communal schemes and pipelines in Alfred Duma municipality. CoGTA will then give a status report on all Municipal Infrastructure Grant projects. Water Affairs will give responses on how we go about getting additional funding. We want to play a meaningful role in ensuring that people do get water supply in the district", said Rev Buthelezi.

He said the previous Administrator wasn't assisting the Mayor to discharge his duties hence he was fired. He emphasized that the Mayor is the face and central power in the municipality. "For the municipality to function, we all must support the vision of the Mayor."

The Honourable MEC Rev. Buthelezi said they want to make sure that the UThukela District receives the financial support it deserves. According to the MEC, the first quarter of DDM in 2025 will be held in Inkosi Langalibalele to discuss water related issues. He then urged everyone to be the serv-

ants of the people. He concluded by saying that thev were here to deliver

UTHUKELA DISTRICT COUNCIL ELECTS NEW DEPUTY MAYOR

he Deputy Mayor of UThukela District Municipality was elected by the Council during a special Council meeting that was held at the Ladysmith Town Hall on October 17. Cllr MC Mkhize, who is from the Inkatha Freedom Party (IFP), will serve alongside the Mayor of UThukela District Inkosi NB Shabalala.

The position of the Deputy Mayor became vacant in February 2023 when the National Command of the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) instructed all its members to vacate their positions following the fall out with the IFP in the province. Cllr MH Shange heeded the call and subsequently resigned from his position

The proceedings were presided over by the Municipal Manager Mr LS Jili and Speaker Cllr TY Nqubuka. Cllr Mkhize was first sworn in as Uthukela District Councillor and EXCO member replacing Cllr SW Khumalo from Inkosi Langalibalele Local Municipality who submitted his resignation letter to Council.

Another resignation was received from EXCO member Cllr MM Khoza from Alfred Duma Local Municipality. Both Councillors are coming from the IFP.

The newly elected Deputy Mayor defeated his rival Cllr AS Mazibuko from the African National Congress (ANC) by 18 votes to 11. He was welcomed by members of various political formations who reminded

him of the daunting task ahead of delivering services to the people.

The Mayor also congratulated Cllr Mkhize by being optimistic that things will be much easier now that the Deputy Mayor position at the UThukela District Council has been filled. In his remarks, the new Deputy Mayor Cllr Mkhize was very brief and thanked his political party for putting a trust in him.

"I know what is expected from me. But what is even more important is that I will support you Ndabezitha as your Deputy Mayor in ensuring that you continue to deliver services to the people." he said. His remarks were applauded by the admiring crowd who had gathered inside the hall at the gallery to witness the proceedings.

Intensification of food inspection as contamination cases soar

n response to an alarming increase in food contamination cases, allegedly linked to food bought from local shops, particularly foreign-owned businesses, uThukela District Municipality announced that it has intensified routine inspections. This was done through inspecting all premises to ensure compliance with food safety regulations and municipal bylaws.

UThukela District Mayor Inkosi NB Shabalala accompanied by Okhahlamba Mayor Cllr V Mlotshwa, Cllr M Khoza and officials conducted business inspections in Bergville under Okhahlamba local municipality going from shop to shop while conducting compliance checks.

The aim of the inspection was to call for communities to ensure the food they buy and consume is fit for human consumption. This emphasis is on the already existing inspections conducted by Municipal Health Inspectors, from time to time to ensure that the food sold at these supermarkets is safe for

human consumption. And to ensure that the environment in which the food is prepared and kept is clean. These inspections take place at least once a month in various local municipalities to ensure food safety compliance.

Inkosi Shabalala said the municipality has intensified its inspections to ensure that food intended for public consumption is safe and properly handled. "In some shops, you will find food, including children's snacks, stored in the vicinity of or directly under chemicals and pesticides and some have expired", said the Mayor.

He also said one of the major contributors to food contamination resulting in serious food poisoning cases was the manner in which food is prepared and stored in these shops. In addition, the Mayor urged residents to read food labels carefully before making purchases. "Ensure that your food products are obtained from reputable suppliers or manufacturers. Avoid overstocking food products that will not move quickly within that

community," he advised. The personal hygiene of those handling food in the shop plays a significant role, particularly when snacks are bought in bulk and repackaged. Overstocking and poor stock rotation result in food reaching their sell-by dates while still within the shop, which is a major challenge.

"We take samples of suspected foods to the laboratory for analysis to check for the presence of contaminants. We conduct targeted weekly operations on tuck shops within the district, focusing on the safety of food sold within these establishments, said Mrs Gugu Mazibuko, Municipal Health Manager.

The inspections were carried out in partnership with the SAPS, Traffic Department, Okhahlamba Local Municipality, Department of Home Affairs, Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environment Affairs (business regulation and consumer protection) and the uThukela District Municipality Environmental Health Practitioners. Several fines were issued, particularly to foreignowned businesses where it was found that they were selling expired food.
